WHY NEW ORLEANS?

As a result of Hurricane Katrina in 2005, 80% of New Orleans was flooded, leaving 172,000 of 215,000 homes damaged. As of August 2006, more than 110,000 homes still needed work! We want to join in the rebuilding of this city as the Church helps bring restoration to these people.

WHO?

We are partnering with Ray Cannata and Redeemer Presbyterian Church of New Orleans for this trip. Redeemer has helped over 100 families in rebuilding their homes since Katrina, but they rely on the help of mission teams to do the work that is needed to rebuild this city over the next 10-20 years. WHAT?

We will be working on demolishing and gutting homes within the city of New Orleans that were damaged by Katrina. We will have the privilege of worshipping with Redeemer on the first Sunday we are in New Orleans.

HOW?

We will leave the evening of Friday, July 11th and return late on Saturday, July 19th. The cost of the trip covers transportation, lodging, and food during our time in New Orleans. *Food on the trip down and back is NOT covered in fee.*

The registration deposit is due with your form and is \$100 per individual or \$200 per family. The entire cost of the trip will be \$350 per person. Scholarships are available, please do not let budget concerns prevent your family from prayerfully considering whether you're called to join us!
